Investment promotion: Case of SUCRECUBE JAPAN Co Ltd.

- SUCRECUBE JAPAN Co Ltd., an International Group has developed an all-in one solution named "TUMIQUI Smart Kit" technology that combines transportable solar power generation and communication equipment to provide ICT services.
- UNIDO ITPO Tokyo Advisor supported the company's selection of local partners and clarified procedures for establishment of a local company, by arranging and bilateral meetings with authorities.
- From the Special Economic Zone of Sandiara, where the Senegalese subsidiary is established, the company
 - ✓ will benefit from tax and customs incentives.
 - ✓ and plans to export to other countries of the regional economic blocs (WAEMU, ECOWAS).











TUMIQUI impacts & contribution to SDG implementation

- ✓ SDG3 improving health and wellbeing of the rural populations - Medical centers recipient of the technology estimate approximately 60,000 people would be impacted, and already more than 1,000 births have been facilitated at night.
- ✓ SDG5 contributing to women's empowerment

 financial independence.
- ✓ SDG7 improving access to clean sources of electricity
