5. MEETING DISCUSSION POINTS

During the team building event, the team discussed about the challenges being faced by the project and further discussed about the solutions to mitigate the challenges. Outlined below are some of the challenges and recommendations that were tabled;

5.1. CHALLENGES

Discussion on the challenges faced in the project are as follows;

- Delayed acquisition of dump truck equipment,
- Vendor management issues,
- Limited training time for students on actual machine (excavator),
- Fuel delivery and management,
- Simulator lab maintenance,
- Shortage of teaching personnel, and
- Student meal allocation.

5.2. FUTURE RECOMMENDATIONS

To address the challenges identified, the following recommendations were proposed;

- Consider initiating training with a rented dump truck instead of waiting for the procurement and delivery of a dump truck. Additionally, consider procuring a construction dump truck based on specified training requirements.
- Trainers should consider suggesting suitable vendors for project supplies.
- Extend training time on actual machine (excavator) for each student from 10 minutes per day to 20 minutes per day.
- Provide comprehensive lesson plans for training.
- Engage a company to supply and deliver fuel on site.

- Maintain cleanliness in simulator labs and introduce special clothing to preserve the equipment.
- Consider providing lunch for all students and involve the Constituency Development Fund (CDF) for support.
- Introduce a catering department at KVTC.

6. TEAM BUILDING EVENT CHALLENGES

The following were some of the challenges that were faced during the team building event;

• Limited departmental involvement, as only one department participated in the activity.

7. RECOMMENDATIONS

The following recommendations should be taken into account for future events;

- Invite ither departments in team-building activities.
- Host the team-building activities tri-annually.

8. CONCLUSION

The team building event proved to be invaluable in fostering a positive work environment and enhancing the quality of work at KVTC. It is expected to promote collaboration among team members, thereby improving productivity and overall team performance.
